FALL LEAF PICKUP SCHEDULE

Leaf pickup will take place each week on **Mondays** and **Tuesdays** beginning October 3rd and 4th and run through December 5th and 6th.

Reminders are as follows:

Leaves **must be** bagged in biodegradable leaf bags and placed curbside by 7AM of the day of pickup. **No alley pickups** except in Holliday Hills.

Twigs, 3 inches and less in diameter, **must be bundled and tied**. (No wire.)

Pickup to the **EAST** of Penn Street, including the east side of Penn Street, in the Borough will be **on Mondays**.

Leaf pickup to the **WEST** of Penn Street, Gaysport, and Holliday Hills, in the Borough will be **on Tuesdays.**

There is no need to call to schedule pickup. Bags that contain recyclables or bags that are taped or stapled will not be picked up (simply fold the top of the bag over).

If items are missed, the pickup will occur the **next week.**

If you think that you may have a leak, please contact the Water Department at 696-0623 to schedule an appointment for one of the Public Works Employees to come and check your home for any leaks.

WHAT IS INFILTRATION /INFLOW (I/I)?

Excess water that flows into sewer pipes from groundwater and stormwater is called infiltration and inflow, or I/I. Groundwater (infiltration) seeps into sewer pipes through holes, cracks, joint failures, and faulty connections. Stormwater (inflow) rapidly flows into sewers via roof drain downspouts, foundation drains, storm drain cross-connections, and through holes in manhole covers. Most I/I is caused by aging infrastructure that needs maintenance or replacement.

Infiltration is groundwater, or groundwater that is influenced by surface water, that enters sewer pipes (interceptors, collectors, manholes (MH), or side sewers) through holes, breaks, joint failures, connection failures and other openings. Infiltration quantities often exhibit seasonal variation in response to groundwater levels. Storm events can trigger a rise in groundwater levels and increase infiltration flows. The highest infiltration flows are observed following significant storm events or following prolonged periods of precipitation.

Inflow is surface water that enters the wastewater system from yard, roof and footing drains, from cross-connections with storm drains, downspouts and sump pumps. Inflow occurs as a result of storm events such as rainfall, snowfall, springs or snow melt that contribute to excessive sewer flows. Peak inflow can occur during heavy storm events when storm sewer systems are surcharged, resulting in hydraulic backups and local ponding. Inflow and infiltration is clear water that enters the sanitary sewer system from a variety of sources.

Why is I/I a problem?

Extra water in the sewer system is a problem because:

It takes up capacity in the sewer pipes and ends up at the regional wastewater treatment plant where it must be treated like sewage, resulting in higher treatment costs.

Requires new and larger wastewater facilities to convey and treat larger volumes of flow, resulting in higher capital expenditures.

I/I flows contribute to sewer system overflows into local homes and the region's waterways, negatively impacting public health and the environment. It is estimate that inflow and infiltration makes up 75 percent of peak flows during winter and rain events and much of this comes from private property.

Protecting the environment and decreasing wastewater treatment costs are the benefit of a regional I/I control program.

SEWER LINE REPLACEMENT PROJECT UPDATE

As you likely noticed, the Borough if full of activity related to the major sewer line replacement project. Snyder Environmental Services, Inc. from Kearneysville, West Virginia is the contractor for the job. To date, approximately 5000 linear feet of sewer main has been replaced in and around the Jr. High School. In total, once the project is completed approximately 40,000 linear feet of sewer main will be replaced with new.

The Authority will be informing our residents in advance through our phone notification system when the contractor will be working on your street. Please be advised that this work schedule is subject to change as weather and other factors might alter the contractor's schedule.

Snyder Environmental Inc. has an advanced team of workers that will be contacting residents in the affected areas in order to locate their sewer lateral. They might request to enter your premises in order to locate your lateral. This team will have proper picture identification and is authorized by the Authority. It is the authority's hope that you allow them to enter your home as this lateral identification is necessary to allow the contractor to place your new lateral tap at the proper location at your property line.

We ask that our residents display a certain amount of restraint and patience during the construction as the authority needs your cooperation and patience in order for the project to proceed in an orderly manner. The main sewer line replacement project is tentatively scheduled to be completed by August 1, 2017 or sooner, if winter weather cooperates. At that time, the homes in the project area will start the process of the private sector responsibility of passing a lateral pressure test. Residents will receive a letter notification from the Hollidaysburg Sewer Authority in advance as to when this private sector work can begin at your residence.

If you have a question or concern, we ask our residents to check out the borough's website as there is information about the project that is updated on a biweekly basis. If your question isn't answered, contact Jessica at 814.695.7543 and she will direct your question to the appropriate person. Once again, the Hollidaysburg Sewer Authority thanks you for your patience and cooperation as the project proceeds.

Filing a complaint protocol:

Residents that feel the need to file a complaint regarding the sewer line replacement project are asked to contact our administrative assistant Jessica at the Borough office 814-695-7543 and she will instruct you on the protocol for filing the complaint. This procedure is necessary so the complaint is logged and sent to the appropriate person in order to resolve your issue.

REMEMBER...MAINTAIN YOUR GRASS!

Please remember to maintain your property. The height of grass and weeds on any premises within the Borough cannot be in excess of six (6) inches according to Chapter 10, Health and Safety, Part 1, Weed Control, Section 101 of the Borough of Hollidaysburg Code of Ordinances. Not properly maintaining your property will put you in violation of the borough ordinance and could lead to legal proceedings.

ELECTRONICS RECYCLING PROGRAM CONTINUES!

Televisions and computers must now be recycled in Pennsylvania, and Blair County residents will be able to do that at the IRC Recycling and Compost facility in Logan Township (Blacksnake Road, near the Buckhorn).

The best news is that the service is free to all county residents. The Compost Facility will be open during regular hours, weekdays (except Wednesdays) from 10AM to 5PM and 9AM to 3PM each Saturday. The facility is closed on holidays.

In addition to computers, monitors, computer peripherals, printers, faxes, and televisions, the following electronic materials are also accepted at our Buckhorn Facility:

- Metal Appliances and Electronics (microwaves, stoves, dishwashers, etc.) are free.
- Small Portable Electronics (ex: portable DVD players)
 - → \$1.00 fee

- Medium-Sized Electronics (ex: DVD players, VCR's)
 - → \$2.00 fee
- Large Non-metal Electronics (ex: stereos, speakers)
 - → \$5.00 fee
- Freon Containing Appliances
