IN DOWNTOWN HOLLIDAYSBURG

Light Up Night is Friday, November 23rd from 5:00 to 7:00pm. Activities include the lighting of the tree and the Chimney Rocks Star.



The Annual Soup Sampling **Contest** will take place from 5pm – 6:30pm during Light Up Night and will feature your favorite soups! Soup **Sampling** tickets are just \$6.00 to try yummy soups and a chance to vote.

The event will include entertainment & ice sculptures by Tim Klock. Santa Land activities will include: a petting zoo & many children's activities for the kids and visits with Santa!

WINTER WEATHER PROCEDURES

In the event of a heavy snowfall, the Mayor will make a snow emergency declaration to begin at either 8:00 am or at 8:00 pm.

The Borough will institute the **odd/even** parking designation during snow emergencies and ONLY during those times.

If the snow emergency begins at **8:00 pm** (in the *EVENing*,) vehicles must be parked on the *EVEN* numbered side of the street; if at **8:00 am** (*morning*), cars must be moved to the *ODD* numbered side of the street. The objective is to achieve bare pavement on all Borough streets within 36 hours after a snowfall has ended.

Snow emergencies will be announced on local media and on

www.hollidaysburgpa.org.

Please remember that *ANY* vehicle that violates the parking regulations imposed by a snow emergency *WILL BE TOWED AT OWNER'S EXPENSE*.

Remember, odd-even parking restrictions are only in effect when a Snow Emergency has been declared!

According to Borough Ordinance, all property and business owners must clear all sidewalks of snow within 24 hours of the end of a snow event!

CHRISTMAS TREE PICK UP

The Borough Public Works Services Crews will be picking up all discarded, live Christmas trees in January. Trees will be picked up the same as the Borough's normal brush pickup; east side of the Borough on Monday and the west side on Tuesday.

Pickup Schedule:

East Side of town on Monday, January 7th and Monday, January 28th.

West Side of town on Tuesday, January 8th and Tuesday, January 29th.

Please do not place the discarded tree into a plastic, tree disposal bag as the trees are to be taken to a compost facility. Have trees curbside by 7:00 am for pickup that day.

LOW BRANCHES ON STREET TREES

The Shade Tree Commission reminds street tree property owners that they should remove low hanging, pedestrian unfriendly branches from their street trees.

Unsightly suckers growing out of the base of trees should be removed as well.

No permit is required for these type of street tree trimmings, however, **permits are still needed for more extensive pruning of the street trees**.

There is no charge for street tree trimming permits. To obtain a street tree trimming permit, please contact a member of the Hollidaysburg Shade Tree Commission.

A NOTE FROM THE CHIEF

Hollidaysburg Police officers recently investigated a number of different scams. These scams have led to the loss of thousands of dollars and a relatively low probability of arrest for the actors. The scam artists rarely live in the United States and utilize multiple layers of anonymity and deception to avoid prosecution. Please be aware receiving a frantic phone call that involves a person in need can cause panic and confusion. Create a "red flag" by making sure family members can recognize these scams. Matters of the heart can blur common sense. If you're asked to send money to a new acquaintance, or family member, often with a sense of urgency, be alert to this "red flag" - it may be a scam.



A phone call from a government employee asking for money or offering to give it away is a red flag! The government will never ask for money or give money away over the telephone. Likewise, more formal methods are utilized for winnings with "publishers clearinghouse" or other agencies. Don't trust phone calls claiming you have won a prize and request monies to "claim" that prize - it may be a scam! NOTICE FROM CODE OFFICER

Please know it is a violation of the Borough's Code of Ordinances to create a safety and health hazard to persons and property by reason of inadequate or improper discharge of storm water. Storm water discharged onto a public street or alley has a high potential of freezing during the winter thus creating a hazard for both vehicles and pedestrians.

The Borough kindly requests your cooperation in this matter, and if you currently have pipes draining storm water from your spouting or sump pump onto a public street or alley, please make the appropriate corrections. All storm water runoff from your spouting, or water discharged from your sump pump is to be infiltrated back into the ground on your property.

DO NOT RAKE LEAVES INTO THE STREET!

Borough Residents are reminded NOT to push or rake fallen leaves into the public streets. This creates a safety hazard and violators will be fined. Fall Brush Pickup continues in the Borough on Mondays and Tuesdays until December 3rd & 4th. Addresses to the east side of Penn Street are to be picked up on Mondays and addresses to the west of Penn Street, Gaysport and Holliday Hills will be collected on Tuesdays.







BUILDING & ZONING PERMITS

The Borough takes tremendous pride in the fact that its residents are consistently doing projects to take care of and maintain their homes. It is one of the great attributes of Hollidaysburg.

Be mindful that Pennsylvania State Law requires that you must obtain appropriate permits to have certain types of projects done. Not obtaining the necessary permits could lead to legal action and fines.

Zoning permits from the Borough may also be necessary. Be sure to make the phone call before your project begins to ensure that the project progresses in a timely manner and that you will not find yourself faced with penalties.
