The **Annual Soup Sampling Contest** will take place from 5pm - 7pm during Light Up Night and will feature your favorite soups! **Soup Sampling** tickets are just \$6.00 to try yummy soups and a chance to vote. 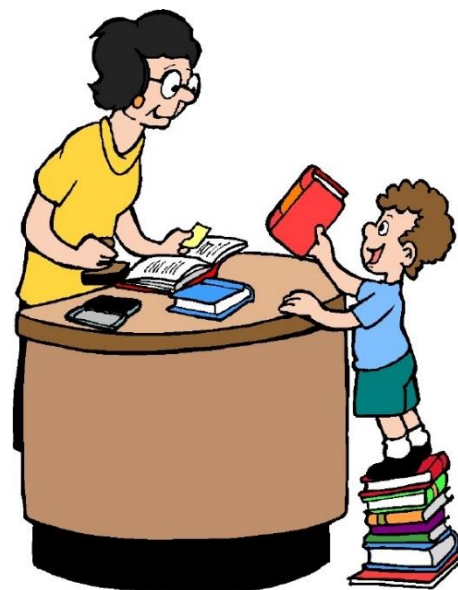

## WINTER WEATHER PROCEDURES

In the event of a heavy snowfall, the Mayor will make a snow emergency declaration to begin at either 8:00 am or at 8:00 pm.

The Borough will institute the **odd/even** parking designation during snow emergencies and **ONLY** during those times.

If the snow emergency begins at **8:00 pm** (in the **EVENing**), vehicles must be parked on the **EVEN numbered** side of the street; if at **8:00 am** (*morning*), cars must be moved to the **ODD numbered** side of the street. The objective is to achieve bare pavement on all Borough streets within 36 hours after a snowfall has ended.

Snow emergencies will be announced on local media and on [www.hollidaysburgpa.org](http://www.hollidaysburgpa.org).

Please remember that **ANY** vehicle that violates the parking regulations imposed by a snow emergency **WILL BE TOWED AT OWNER'S EXPENSE**.

Remember, odd-even parking restrictions are only in effect when a Snow Emergency has been declared!

According to Borough Ordinance, **all property and business owners** must clear all sidewalks of snow within **24 hours** of the end of a snow event!

## CHRISTMAS TREE PICK UP

The Borough Public Works Services Crews will be picking up all discarded, live Christmas trees in January. Trees will be picked up the same as the Borough's normal brush pickup; east side of the Borough on Monday and the west side on Tuesday.

### Pickup Schedule:

East Side of town on Monday, January 11<sup>th</sup> and Monday, January 18<sup>th</sup>.

West Side of town on Tuesday, January 12<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday, January 19<sup>th</sup>.

Please do not place the discarded tree into a plastic, tree disposal bag as the trees are to be taken to a compost facility. Have trees curbside by 7:00 am for pickup that day.

## LOW BRANCHES ON STREET TREES

The Shade Tree Commission reminds street tree property owners that they **should remove low hanging, pedestrian unfriendly branches** from their street trees.

**Unsightly suckers growing out of the base of trees should be removed** as well.

No permit is required for these type of street tree trimmings, however, **permits are still needed for more extensive pruning of the street trees**.

There is no charge for street tree trimming permits. To obtain a street tree trimming permit, please contact a member of the Hollidaysburg Shade Tree Commission.

## A NOTE FROM THE CHIEF

# DO NOT RAKE LEAVES INTO THE STREET!

Borough Residents are reminded NOT to push or rake fallen leaves into the public streets. This creates a safety hazard and violators will be fined. Fall Brush Pickup continues in the Borough on Mondays and Tuesdays through December 8, 2015. Addresses to the east side of Penn Street are to be picked up on Mondays and addresses to the west of Penn Street, Gaysport and Holliday Hills will be collected on Tuesdays.

# SIGNS IN PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAYS

Please keep in mind! According to the Hollidaysburg Borough Ordinance – Chapter 27, Part 5, Section 507.3B, **no signs** are to be placed in the public right-of-way with the exception of a select few.

Those exceptions include government postings, bus stop signs, information regarding public utilities, and emergency warnings.

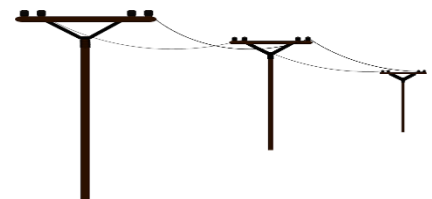
Any signs such as yard sale advertisements erected in the public right-of-way are forfeited to the public and subject to confiscation.



# POSTING ON UTILITY POLES...

Did you know state law *prohibits* the posting of signs or outdoor advertising on any utility pole? Per the law it is a Title 18 Section 6905 Summary Violation and the violator could be subject to a *citation*.

In addition to being against the law, it is a hazard to workers that may need to climb the pole. Rethink that idea to staple your yard sale to the utility pole. Those signs you fasten to the poles are subject to confiscation.



# IRC NEWS



## Free IRC My-Waste App

In an effort to make recycling easier for everyone, the IRC has worked with My-Waste to develop a smart phone app for our area. Exciting features for residents include: the ability to report a missed collection, sign-up for alerts, set a personal recycling calendar, and search for nearby dropoffs.

You may use this feature on your desktop or download the mobile app to your smart phone device. You can find the app on our website, Google Play, or iTunes.

**R&D Compost Facility** The R&D Compost Facility located in Duncansville will remain open through spring. The facility will be open Tuesdays from 12 pm – 5 pm. Screened Compost or Screened Mulch will be available for purchase between the hours of 3 pm and 5 pm. No electronics accepted.

**Recycling Bins** If you still need a recycling bin, you can pick them up at the IRC office, IRC municipal buildings or Scan QR code to download the My-Waste App highway yards. The residential bin distribution event held the end of October was a rousing success but some residents missed the event.

- Hollidaysburg Municipal Building (401 Blair Street)
- IRC Office at Altoona City Hall (1301 – 12th Street, Suite 8 in the basement)
- Altoona Highway Yard (5010

Sixth Avenue at Commerce Park)

- Logan Township Municipal Building (100 Chief Logan Circle just off 26<sup>th</sup> Street and Pleasant Valley Boulevard)

Residents should ideally have a bin with a lid for paper recycling and an open bin for bottles and cans. If you have an old damaged bin or a county bin (that says “Blair County Recycles”) and wish to trade it in for a bin that can take a lid, please bring in the bin for a trade-in.

Very large households may qualify for a 25 gallon round container.

Lids are limited to one per household for paper recycling.

## IT IS PENNSYLVANIA LAW!

The Borough takes tremendous pride in the fact that its residents are consistently doing projects to take care of and maintain their homes. It is one of the great attributes of Hollidaysburg.

Be mindful that Pennsylvania State Law requires that you must obtain appropriate permits to have certain types of projects done.

Not obtaining the necessary permits could lead to legal action and fines.

Zoning permits from the Borough may also be necessary. Be sure to make the phone call before your project begins to ensure that the project progresses in a timely manner and that you will not find yourself faced with penalties.
