FALL BRUSH PICKUP

Brush pickup will take place <u>each week</u> on <u>Mondays</u> and <u>Tuesdays</u> beginning October 7th and 8th and run through December 2nd and 3rd.

Reminders are as follows:

Leaves & brush **must be** bagged in biodegradable leaf bags and placed curbside by 7AM of the day of pickup. **No alley pickups** except in Holliday Hills.

Twigs, 3 inches and less in diameter, **must be bundled and tied**. (No wire.)

Pickup to the **EAST** of Penn Street, including the east side of Penn Street, in the Borough will be **on Mondays**.

Leaf pickup to the **WEST** of Penn Street, Gaysport, and Holliday Hills, in the Borough will be **on Tuesdays.**

There is no need to call to schedule pickup. Bags that contain recyclables or bags that are taped or stapled **will not be picked up** (simply fold the top of the bag over).

If items are missed, the pickup will occur the **next week. No exceptions!**

How do I Dispose of Latex Paint?

- Use it up: Once you use up the paint, dispose of the empty paint can in the regular trash or recycle it if possible.
- Give it away: Give it away in the original can and with the label intact to schools or charitable organizations that need it.
- Dry it out: Liquid latex paint cannot be placed in your regular trash. However, once it is in a solid form latex paint can be disposed of with your household trash.

BE ON THE LOOKOUT FOR LEAKS!



This chart shows that it does not take much of a leak to use a lot of water!

A dripping faucet, a running toilet, or a garden hose that does not shut off completely are some conditions that can cause water and sewer bills to increase. If you suspect that you may have a leak, please contact the Water Department at 696-0623 to schedule an appointment to have your home investigated for leaks. There is no charge to have this check performed.


ALLEY & SIDEWALK OBSTURCTIONS



Alleys are an integral part of the street grid network. They provide access to the rear of lots, side streets, give motorists and pedestrians' alternate routes of travel, and utility companies a place for their facilities. Sidewalks provide a safe place to walk and an alternative mode of transportation. Emergency responders count on clear passage for efficient response. These benefits and rights become hampered along with claims of property and vehicle damage and possible injury when obstructions and encroachments occur within these travel ways.

The Borough's Community Development Department has expended an inordinate amount of time this year responding to complaints about obstructed alleys, streets, and alleys. Since obstructing these rights-of-way is a property maintenance code violation, the Department offers the following suggestions for property owners:

- Mow areas along with mowing yards,
- Prune your trees and trim or remove any vegetation that obstructs or grows into alleys, streets, and sidewalks with prompt disposal of the trimmings,
- Limbs and vegetation should have an overhead clearance of alleys, streets and sidewalks to eliminate obstruction of public travel. It is recommended that overhead clearances of 8' for sidewalks and 14' for streets and alleys be maintained,
- Trimming vegetation along the street scape not only beautifies the community but also enhances neighborhood safety,
- Check recycling and disposal options before storing items in close proximity to an alley that you are unsure of how to dispose of.



STREET TREE PERMITS

Please remember permits are needed for pruning or removal of the street trees! There is no charge for street tree permits, however, not obtaining a permit may result in a fine up to \$600. To obtain a street tree permit, please contact a member of the Hollidaysburg Shade Tree Commission or call 695-7543.
