BOROUGH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES THURSDAY, OCTOBER 10, 2019 7:00 PM COUNCIL CHAMBERS

CALL TO ORDER: This meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by President Joseph A. Pompa.

PRESENT: A quorum was present including members of Council as follows: Joseph A. Pompa; Patrick Plummer; Jeffrey Ketner; Mark L. Shawley; Sean M. Burke; Joyce Lowe and Brady Leahey. Others in attendance: Borough Manager Jim Gehret; Borough Secretary Patricia J. Duron; Attorney Nathan Karn, Building Code Official Gerald Harbison, Director of Community Relations & Events Katrina Pope, Fire Marshal David Zeek and Chief Rodney B. Estep. Mayor Dodson was absent.

<u>PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:</u> President Pompa led the Pledge of Allegiance followed by a moment of silence.

MINUTES: The minutes dated September 12, 2019 were presented for approval. A motion was made by Mr. Shawley to approve the minutes, and was then seconded by Mr. Plummer. A vote was taken with the motion carrying in a vote of seven votes in favor to zero votes not in favor.

<u>MANAGER'S REPORT:</u> Mr. Gehret reported that his manager's report was in their agenda binders.

<u>FINANCIAL REPORT:</u> Mr. Gehret advised that the pension payments had not been distributed out of the funds yet.

PLANNING/ZONING/CODE ENFORCEMENT: Gerald (Jerry) Harbison advised that his report was in their agenda binders. He answered some questions regarding the fire company's permit for the new siren.

<u>COMMUNITY RELATIONS & EVENTS:</u> Katrina advised that the last Downtown LIVE! Concert was a great success and that Pumpkinfest was scheduled for Saturday, October 12th.

<u>FIRE MARSHAL REPORT:</u> Dave Zeek was there and reported that the he was busy with activities related to fire prevention week. There was some discussion between Council Members and Dave regarding the recently installed fire siren.

<u>MAYOR'S REPORT:</u> The Mayor was absent but had requested the Borough Manager to thank everyone for the prayers and get well wishes for his grandson. Mr. Gehret also reported that there had been a \$100 donation for Patriot Park.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

<u>Paul Wolfe, 209 Wayne Street:</u> spoke negatively about the fire siren. Presented a petition against the siren to Borough Council.

<u>Richard Latker, 703 Allegheny Street, Hollidaysburg Watch Dog:</u> spoke against the fire siren. He also made comments regarding the recent Zoning Hearing Board decision and the Borough's comprehensive plan.

<u>Daniel Rhine</u>, 309 <u>Mulberry Street</u>: made negative comments regarding the fire siren.

<u>Don Delozier, 401 South Juniata Street:</u> introduced Travis McCabe, representative of the Hollidaysburg Area Community Partnership. Invited people to a Meet and Greet on October 16th.

Walt Zolna, 602 Clark Street: spoke in favor of the fire siren and suggested a compromise.

Eric Schmidt, 1303 Pine Street: spoke in favor of the fire siren.

<u>Curtis Greenland</u>, 519 <u>Garber Street</u>: spoke in favor of the siren as he cannot hear it, but suggested another method be used.

<u>Steve Albright, 419-421 Bedford Street:</u> spoke in favor of the fire siren, and voiced concerns about the intersection at Newry and Bedford Streets and the except right turn stop sign.

RESOLUTION NO. 2019-23 AUTHORIZING RESOLUTION OF THE HOLLIDAYSBURG BOROUGH BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Pennsylvania Act 179 of 1984, Hollidaysburg Borough, is eligible to apply for and receive an annual allocation of Community Development Block Grant

(CDBG) funds from the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (PA DCED) with said funds to be used to undertake housing and community development projects, which primarily benefit person of low-to moderate-income; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Hollidaysburg has specifically designated the County of Blair to apply for and administer their Community Development Block Grant for Fiscal Year FY2019; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Hollidaysburg has selected project(s) to be included within the application for Community Development Block Grant funds for Fiscal Year FY2019 and concur with the program contained therein; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Hollidaysburg in cooperation with the County of Blair have conducted the required public hearings to obtain citizen input as well as to formulate a Community Development Plan, which identifies and prioritizes needs along with the activities to be undertaken with CDBG funds to address such needs; and

WHEREAS, the County of Blair on behalf of Hollidaysburg Borough have prepared an application for Community Development Block Grant Funds for Fiscal Year FY2019 including all Understandings and Assurances contained within the application for a Community Development Block Grant in the amount of \$108,297; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the person identified as the Chief Elected Official of the County of Blair may act in regards to the application for Community Development Block Grant for FY2019 funds and to provide such information as may be required; and the officers of the Borough, the President and Secretary, are hereby authorized to affix their signatures to the application for FY2019 funds.
