SPRING BRUSH PICKUP TO BEGIN

The Borough will begin brush pickup this year in **April**.

Pickup will begin on **Monday, April 3, 2017** and continue **EACH WEEK** through **Tuesday, May 23, 2017**.

Throughout that time, Borough workers will pick up and haul away compostable waste such as:

- Dead Leaves
- Dead Plant Material
- Tree & Brush Trimmings
- Branches - up to 3" in diameter & 6' in length.

Brush and branches must be bundled with string or twine. Please do not use wire to bundle.

Items that will **NOT** be picked up are:

- Stone
- Gravel
- Junk
- Garbage
- Dirt
- Appliances



Borough crews will pick up all brush and bags on the **East** side of **Penn Street** every **Monday** and items will be picked up on the **West** side of **Penn Street** every **Tuesday**.

If your items were not set out in time or they were missed, they will be picked up the **FOLLOWING WEEK**. Items must be

placed curbside by 7AM, and the only alley pickups will be **Sweet Cherry Court** in Holliday Hills.

You can also drop your items at the **IRC Duncansville Recycling & Compost Facility**. It is open **Tuesdays only – 12PM – 5PM**.

Directions to the IRC Duncansville Recycling and Compost Facility from Hollidaysburg: Follow US-22 W to the Route 764 Intersection in Duncansville. Make left onto Route 764. Follow Route 764 approximately one (1) mile. Facility will be on the left.

For the rest of the **summer** the pickups will take place on the **Mondays and Tuesdays of the 2nd & 4th week** of each month.

SUMMER ART CAMPS

SEWER REPLACEMENT PROJECT UPDATE

The Sewer Improvements Project continues to progress on schedule. Phase I of the project, taking place west of Penn Street, between Bel Aire Road and Allegheny Street is very near completion. As of March 23, 2017, all of the mainlines, manholes and observation stacks have been installed by the contractor. Beginning in early April, the contractor will be focusing primarily on project site restoration, which will include street paving, sidewalk replacement and landscaping. As the public construction stage of the Phase I project comes to a close, it is time for property owners to connect their privately owned sewer service laterals to the Hollidaysburg Sewer Authority's (HSA) mainline. Over the next few weeks, all property owners within the Phase I project area will receive a "Notice to Proceed" with their private side work. This notice will contain all of the details necessary for homeowners to comply with the HSA's regulations for connection and pressure testing.

Construction for Phase II of the project, taking place east of Penn Street, along Jones Street, and between Garber Street and Walnut Street, began in late February with mainline and lateral installation on Jones Street. Construction for this phase is expected to continue until early 2018.

As in Phase I of the project, the contractor for this phase, R.A. Monzo Construction, Inc., has a "scout" team that is working

ahead of the construction crews, locating sewer laterals. This process will likely require the contractor to enter your premises in order to locate your service lateral. This team has been authorized by the Sewer Authority, and will provide proper picture identification prior to entering your premises. It is the Authority's hope that you will permit them access when needed, as lateral identification is necessary to allow the contractor to place your new lateral tap at the proper location at your property line.

Filing a complaint protocol:

Residents that wish to file a complaint regarding the sewer line replacement project are asked to contact our administrative assistant Jessica at the Borough office (695-7543) and she will instruct you on the protocol for filing the complaint. This procedure is necessary so the complaint is logged and sent to the appropriate person in order to resolve your issue.

A NOTE FROM THE CHIEF

Chief Gehret wants to remind everyone to beware of the "IRS Scam."

The IRS Scam involves someone posing as an "IRS Agent" calling or emailing about back taxes. Threats of penalties and jail time will be made which are then followed

up with the option to send cash for the back taxes.

If a call like this is received, take the following steps:

- Assume it's a scam. If you have back taxes, a letter will be received and not a phone call.
- Hang up immediately offering no information.
- Report the incident to the U.S. Treasury inspector general for tax administration at 800-366-4484.

HOLLIDAYSBURG BOROUGH SEWER CALL RESPONSE POLICY REMINDER

The Hollidaysburg Sewer Authority at its September 13, 2010 meeting adopted a change in the sewer call response policy. The following policy is in effect:

1) The Borough will respond to all sewer backup calls in a timely manner. If you have a sewer problem/backup at your residence, please call the Borough office at 814-695-7543 to report your problem. If it is afterhours please call 695-7543 and you will be prompted to leave a message for the oncall supervisor who will return your call promptly! A borough staff member will respond to all calls no matter what time of day or night.

2) If there is a sewer clean out at the property line and it can be determined who is responsible for the blockage, either

the borough crew or a homeowner hired plumber will unclog the blockage.

3) If there is no clean out at the property line and the Hollidaysburg sewer main is clear, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to unclog all blockages on the service lateral. This will remain the case until the homeowner installs a clean out at the property line.

4) The Borough will in **no instance** enter into any residents home to access the plumbing to unclog a sewer backup.

PA WALKWORKS

Hollidaysburg Borough is a part of the Pennsylvania WalkWorks Program, an effort to increase physical activity in the area. PA WalkWorks is a grant funded program that encourages sustainable physical activity through the built environment, social supports, and healthy lifestyle behaviors.

Two walking routes have been created in the borough. Walking route A, also known as the Historic Hollidaysburg Route, is a counterclockwise loop and is 1.63 miles in length. It begins and ends on Allegheny Street. Walking route B, the Gaysport Route, is two counterclockwise loops and is 1.11 miles in length. This route begins and ends in the Canal Basin parking lot. SIGNS IN PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAYS



Please keep in mind! According to the Hollidaysburg Borough Ordinance – Chapter 27, Part 5, Section 507.3B, **no signs** are to be placed in the public right-of-way with the exception of a select few. Those exceptions include government postings, bus stop signs, information regarding public utilities, and emergency warnings.

Any signs such as yard sale advertisements erected in the public right-of-way are forfeited to the public and subject to confiscation.

IT IS PENNSYLVANIA LAW!

The Borough takes tremendous pride in the fact that its residents are consistently doing projects to take care of and maintain their homes. It is one of the great attributes of Hollidaysburg.

With summer on its way, many Borough residents are planning to remodel or initiate other projects regulated by Borough construction codes.

Be mindful that Pennsylvania State Law requires that you must obtain appropriate permits to

have certain types of projects done including but not limited to swimming pools (in or above ground). Not obtaining the necessary permits could lead to legal action and fines.

The Building Code Department is available to answer any questions you may have about construction Zoning permits from the Borough may also be necessary. Be sure to make the phone call before your project begins to ensure that the project progresses in a timely

manner and that you will not find yourself faced with penalties.
