BRUSH PICKUP CONTINUES

Brush pickup will continue <u>each week on</u>
<u>Mondays and Tuesdays</u> through

December 5th and 6th.

Reminders are as follows:

Leaves & brush **must be** bagged in biodegradable leaf bags and placed curbside by 7 am of the day of pickup. **No alley pickups** except in Holliday Hills.

Twigs, 3 inches and less in diameter, must be bundled and tied. (No wire.) Pickup to the EAST of Penn Street, including the east side of Penn Street, in the Borough will be on Mondays.

Leaf pickup to the **WEST** of Penn Street, Gaysport, and Holliday Hills, in the Borough will be **on Tuesdays.**

There is no need to call to schedule pickup. Bags that contain recyclables or bags that are taped or stapled **will not be picked up** (simply fold the top of the bag over).

If items are missed, the pickup will occur the **next week. No exceptions!**

PICKUP WILL CONTINUE THROUGH DECEMBER 5TH & 6TH!



WINTER WEATHER PROCEDURES

In the event of a heavy snowfall, the Mayor will make a snow emergency declaration to begin at either 8:00 am or at 8:00 pm.

The Borough will institute the **odd/even** parking designation during snow emergencies and ONLY during those times.

If the snow emergency begins at **8:00 pm** (in the *EVENing*,) vehicles must be parked on the *EVEN* **numbered** side of the street; if at **8:00 am** (*morning*), cars must be moved to the *ODD* **numbered** side of the street. The objective is to achieve bare pavement on all Borough streets within 36 hours after a snowfall has ended.

Snow emergencies will be announced on local media, on the website www.hollidaysburgpa.org. & the borough Facebook page.

Please remember that *ANY* vehicle that violates the parking regulations imposed by a snow emergency *WILL BE*TOWED AT OWNER'S EXPENSE.

Remember, odd-even parking restrictions are only in effect when a Snow Emergency has been declared! According to Borough Ordinance, all property and business owners must clear all sidewalks of snow within 24 hours of the end of a snow event!

CHRISTMAS TREE PICK UP



The Borough Public Works Services Crews will be picking up all discarded, live Christmas trees in January.

Trees will be picked up the same as the Borough's normal brush pickup; east side of the Borough on Monday and the west side on Tuesday.

Pickup Schedule:

East Side of town on Monday, **January 9^{th}** and Monday, **January 23^{rd}**.

West Side of town on Tuesday, January 10th and Tuesday, January 24th.

Please do not place the discarded tree into a plastic, tree disposal bag as the trees will to be taken to a compost facility.

Have trees curbside by 7:00 am for pickup that day.

SNOW & SIDEWALKS

When the leaves start dropping the snow isn't far behind. Here's a reminder of the Borough's snow removal ordinances:



Residents are required to shovel walks the full width of the sidewalk or thirty (30) inches, whichever is less. Snow may not be shoveled into the street except in the C2 Community Business District (Downtown) to maintain access to parking meters.

Downtown sidewalks are to be cleared of snow and ice from the building face to the curb and may be deposited into the street.

Snow and ice shall be removed from sidewalks within twenty-four (24) hours after the cessation of any fall of snow, sleet or freezing rain. In the event snow and/or ice on a sidewalk has become so hard that it cannot be removed without likelihood of damage to the sidewalk, sand or other abrasive may be put on the sidewalk to make travel reasonably safe; and shall, as soon as thereafter weather permits, be cleared.

Snow or ice shall not be deposited on or immediately next to a fire hydrant, any sidewalk, roadway or loading and unloading area of a public transportation system.

RAVE ALERT





The **RAVE alert system** is a rapid notification system. The Borough uses this to alert residents to possible water outages, disruptions, etc. This is how it works: water customers provide a good contact phone number to the water billing office that they wish to have added to the call list. This can be a property owner/account holder, or tenant. In the case of an apartment building, as long as there are separate meters per tenant, each one may enroll in the RAVE alert system. If there is one meter, one number may be enrolled. Alerts are usually "sent out" at 5:00 pm on the day before the outage or disruption is to take place. The alert will be a recorded message. Keep in mind that once you enroll, if you get a new phone number, you will need to update the information with the Borough. Contact the water billing office at (814) 696-0623.


HISTORIC DISTRICT **BRICKS & MORTAR**

Arguably, it's bricks, stones and mortar that holds the Historic District together. Special care is needed in performing maintenance of these materials to prevent damage and preserve the historic integrity and appearance. This is why a Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) is required for repointing and/or cleaning masonry walls, stone and brick. The Historic Architectural Review Board (HARB) and Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) meet often to review COA applications and work with property owners to ensure that the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation are applied. Sandblasting with dry or wet grit or other abrasives, high pressure washing, and use of certain chemical products on brick or stone surfaces are not permitted. Removal of deteriorated mortar by hand raking is preferred whereas, removal by electric saws and hammering are not. Please contact the Community Development Department at 695-3880 if you have any questions about an exterior renovation project you may have or if assistance with completing a COA Application is needed.


