BRUSH PICKUP CONTINUES

Brush pickup will continue <u>each week on</u> <u>Mondays and Tuesdays</u> and run through December 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} .

Reminders are as follows:

Leaves & brush **must be** bagged in biodegradable leaf bags and placed curbside by 7AM of the day of pickup. **No alley pickups** except in Holliday Hills.

Twigs, 3 inches and less in diameter, **must be bundled and tied**. (No wire.)

Pickup to the **EAST** of Penn Street, including the east side of Penn Street, in the Borough will be **on Mondays**.

Brush pickup to the **WEST** of Penn Street, Gaysport, and Holliday Hills, in the Borough will be **on Tuesdays.**

Bags that contain recyclables or bags that are taped or stapled **will not be picked up** (simply fold the top of the bag over). If items are missed, the pickup will occur the next week. **No exceptions!**

PICKUP RUNS THROUGH DECEMBER 2ND & 3RD!



WINTER WEATHER PROCEDURES

In the event of a heavy snowfall, the Mayor will make a snow emergency declaration to begin at either 8:00 am or at 8:00 pm.

The Borough will institute the **odd/even** parking designation during snow emergencies and ONLY during those times.

If the snow emergency begins at **8:00 pm** (in the *EVENing*,) vehicles must be parked on the *EVEN* **numbered** side of the street; if at **8:00 am** (*morning*), cars must be moved to the *ODD* **numbered** side of the street. The objective is to achieve bare pavement on all Borough streets within 36 hours after a snowfall has ended.

Snow emergencies will be announced on local media, on the website <u>www.hollidaysburgpa.org</u>. & the borough Facebook page.

Please remember that *ANY* vehicle that violates the parking regulations imposed by a snow emergency *WILL BE TOWED AT OWNER'S EXPENSE*.

Remember, odd-even parking restrictions are only in effect when a Snow Emergency has been declared!

According to Borough Ordinance, **all property and business owners** must clear all sidewalks of snow within **24 hours** of the end of a snow event!

BE ALERT FOR FROZEN WATER PIPES!

During cold spells be mindful of your water lines in your basement. If the lines are not in a heated space, they can freeze and burst during cold weather.

Wrap lines with insulation or a heat tape to keep them from freezing. Make sure windows are closed and that any openings to the outside are sealed. In very cold weather, as a precaution, you could run a faucet very slowly.



WE HAVE THE ADDRESS, BUT WHERE IS IT?

The Borough of Hollidaysburg Fire Marshal and Borough Director of Community Development would like to remind you that it is a requirement through the International Building and Residential Code to have your address marked on your property. This isn't just so the pizza place can get your delivery there while it's still warm, it can be a matter of life and death. Police, Fire, and EMS need to be able to locate your property in case of an emergency. Here is what the Code says on address markers:



• Address identification shall be legible and placed in a position that is visible from the street or road fronting the property.

- Address identification characters shall contrast with their background
- Each character shall be not less than 4 inches (1/2 mm) in height with a stroke width of not less than 0.5 inch (12.7 mm)

In addition to the code, the address should be in a well-lit area so that it can be seen at night. Should you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact either the Fire Marshal or the Director of Community Development.

CHRISTMAS TREE PICK UP



The Borough Public Works Services Crews will be picking up all discarded, live Christmas trees in January.

Trees will be picked up in the same way as the Borough's normal brush pickup; east side of the Borough on Monday and the west side on Tuesday.

Pickup Schedule:

East Side of town on Monday, January 6^{th} and Monday, January $27^{th}.$

West Side of town on Tuesday, January 7^{th} and Tuesday, January 28^{th} .

Please do not place the discarded tree into a plastic, tree disposal bag as the trees will to be taken to a compost facility.

Have trees curbside by 7:00 am for pickup that day.

DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME, SAVES MORE THAN JUST TIME!

Daylight Savings Time is **Sunday November 3, 2024**. As we remember to turn clocks back an hour, The Borough of Hollidaysburg Fire Marshal and Borough Director of Community Development would like to encourage residents to check their batteries in their smoke detectors and carbon monoxide alarms.

If you do not have smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms installed in your home, please remember that code requires smoke alarms in all dwelling units and carbon monoxide alarms in buildings that have fuel-burning appliances or attached garages.

Here are some areas where smoke detectors are required:

- In each sleeping room
- Outside each separate sleeping area in the immediate vicinity of the bedrooms
- On each additional story of the dwelling, including basements and habitable attics and not including crawl spaces and uninhabitable attics. In dwellings units with split levels and without an intervening door between levels, a smoke alarm installed on the upper level shall suffice for the adjacent lower level provided that the lower level is less than one full story below the upper level
- Smoke alarms shall be installed not less than 3 feet horizontally from the door or opening to a bathroom that contains a bathtub or shower unless this would prevent placement of a smoke alarm required by this section.
