


CRUISE-IN 2024

Hollidaysburg Borough Council has authorized a grant program for all residents and property owners. This grant will reimburse the property owner 25% of the cost of replacement, installation, or repair of a pedestrian sidewalk & curbs located along a public street. Applications will be reviewed in the order they are received. The program will remain open until funds are exhausted or until Council closes the program. Grant and Permit Applications are available at the Borough Building, 401 Blair Street, during regular office hours.

BE ON THE LOOKOUT FOR LEAKS

As you can see from the chart below it does not take much of a leak to use a lot of water. A dripping faucet, a toilet running periodically, and a garden hose that does not shut off completely are just a few items that can cause your water and sewer bills to increase. If you think you may have a leak, please contact the Water Department at 814-696-0623 to schedule an appointment for one of the Public Works employees to come and check your home for any leaks.

SUMMER PICKUP TO CONTINUE IN THE BOROUGH



Borough workers will pick up and haul away compostable waste such as: dead leaves, dead plant material, tree and brush trimmings and branches up to 3" in diameter and 6' in length. Brush and branches must be bundled with string or twine. Please do not use wire to bundle.

Items that will not be picked up are: stone, garbage, gravel, dirt, junk, and appliances.

Borough crews will pick up all brush and bags on the **East** side of **Penn Street** every **Monday** and items will be picked up on the **West** side of **Penn Street** every **Tuesday**.

If your items were not set out in time or they were missed, they will be picked up the **NEXT SCHEDULED WEEK**. Items must be placed curbside **by 7:00 am**, and the only alley pickups will be **Sweet Cherry Court** in Holliday Hills.

For the rest of the summer the pickups will take place on Mondays and Tuesdays of the 2^{nd} and 4^{th} FULL WEEK of each month. The following is a list of the pickup dates:

STREET TREES

The Shade Tree Commission reminds street tree property owners that they should remove low hanging, pedestrian unfriendly branches from their street trees and public sidewalks.



Unsightly suckers growing out of the base of trees should be removed as well. No

permit is required for this type of street tree trimmings; however, permits are still needed for more extensive pruning and removal of the street trees.

There is no charge for street tree permits. To obtain a street tree trimming permit, please contact the Department of Community Development located at the second floor of the Borough Building or call us at 814-695-7543.

YARD AND GARAGE SALES, MISSING ANIMALS, & UTILITY POLES

The yard and garage sale season are here as many local residents have hosted these already this year. Sadly, we have also seen a number of pets go missing this year in the Borough. While the Borough wants residents to promote their sales and search efforts, posting signs on utility poles with metal fasteners is prohibited by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Please use alternative ways of advertising.

CODE COMPLIANCE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Blair County has announced a grant program which will help low to moderate income households (must meet current HUD section 8 income guidelines) with code compliance/property maintenance repairs. The grant is available for current owner-occupied homeowners. If you have received a Hollidaysburg Borough Notice of Violation and want to apply for this grant, you may contact the Dept. of Community Development. Applications are available at the municipal building at 401 Blair Street.

POOL PERMITS

The Dept. of Community Development reminds residents and owners that residential swimming pools and hot tubs may require a zoning and building permit. The Uniform Construction Code requires that any pool or hot tub that has the capacity to hold two (2) feet of water needs to have a building permit. Please contact the office of Community Development prior to installation of either one to discuss the application process.

BUILDING & ZONING PERMITS REMINDER



Summer is the time of year when property owners embark on property maintenance or new construction projects. Please make sure that you check with the Dept. of Community Development about the necessary zoning and/or building permits for your projects.

The owner; or the contractor, may apply for that permit if the owner designates the contractor as an "Authorized Agent." If work that requires a permit is started without the required permit; a "Stop Work Order" will be issued and work activity will cease until the proper permits are obtained.
