April showers bring May flowers!

SPRING & SUMMER BRUSH PICKUP

The Borough will begin brush pickup this year in **April**. Pickup will begin on **Monday, April 6, 2015** and continue **EACH WEEK** through **Tuesday, May 19, 2015**.

Throughout that time, Borough workers will pick up and haul away compostable waste such as:

- Dead Leaves
- Dead Plant Material
- Tree & Brush Trimmings
- Branches - up to 3" in diameter & 6' in length.

Brush and branches must be bundled with string or twine. Please do not use

wire to bundle.

Items that will **NOT** be picked up are:

- Stone
- Garbage
- Gravel
- Dirt
- Junk
- Appliances



Borough crews will pick up all brush and bags on the **East** side of **Penn Street** every **Monday** and items will be picked up on the **West** side of **Penn Street** every **Tuesday**.

If your items were not set out in time or they were missed,

they will be picked up the **FOLLOWING WEEK**. Items must be placed curbside by 7am, and the only alley pickups will be **Sweet Cherry Court** in Holliday Hills.

You can also drop your items at the **IRC Duncansville Recycling & Compost Facility**. It is open **Tuesdays only - 12pm - 5pm**. Please see directions at the bottom of the page.

For the rest of the summer the pickups will take place on the Mondays and Tuesdays of the 2nd & 4th week of each month.

Free IRC My-Waste App

In an effort to make recycling easier for everyone, the IRC has worked with My-Waste to develop a smart phone app for our area. Exciting features for residents include: the ability to report a missed collection, sign-up for alerts, set a

personal recycling calendar, and search for nearby drop-offs. You may use this feature on your desktop or download the mobile app to your smart phone device.

You can find the app on our website, Google Play, or iTunes.

R&D Compost Facility The R&D Compost Facility located in Duncansville will remain open through spring. The facility will be open Tuesdays from 12pm - 5pm. Screened Compost or Screened Mulch will be available for purchase between the hours of 3 PM and 5 PM. No electronics accepted.

Recycling Bins If you still need a recycling bin, you can pick them up at the IRC office, IRC municipal buildings or

highway yards. The residential bin distribution event held the end of October was a rousing success but some residents missed the event.

- Hollidaysburg Municipal Building (401 Blair Street)
- IRC Office at Altoona City Hall (1301 – 12th Street, Suite 8 in the basement)
- Altoona Highway Yard (5010 Sixth Avenue at Commerce Park)
- Logan Township Municipal Building (100 Chief Logan Circle just off 26th Street and Pleasant Valley Boulevard)

Residents should ideally have a bin with a lid for paper recycling and an open bin for bottles and cans. If you have an old damaged

bin or a county bin (that says “Blair County Recycles”) and wish to trade it in for a bin that can take a lid, please bring in the bin for a trade-in. Very large households may qualify for a 25 gallon round container.

Lids are limited to one per household for paper recycling. Wheel kits are available for purchase at the IRC office to all residents for \$2.00 while supplies last. If you have questions please call 942-7472 or email



ALLEGHENY STREET CRUISE-IN & SIDEWALK SALE

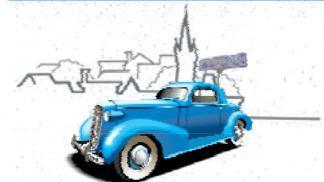

RAIN GARDEN AT THE YMCA

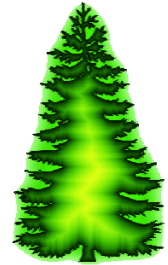
The Blair Conservation District (BCD) has a grant from National Fish and Wildlife Services to install green infrastructure practices throughout the county as demonstration sites. The sites are selected to improve water quality by catching and treating storm-water runoff AND because they are visible to the public. The green infrastructure planned for the YMCA is a series of rain gardens near its parking lot. This project will be completed April 8th and 9th as a team effort including the BCD, the Borough, the YMCA, Stiffler McGraw & Associates, the IRC, and Hollidaysburg Area Jr High students!

MEMORIAL DAY PARADE

CHANGING THE FLEET

Beginning in 2015, Chief Gehret has decided to change our fleet of vehicles over to the Ford Explorer Interceptor. This transition will occur gradually over the next several years. Chief Gehret has found increased expenses with the Dodge Chargers in their high performance configurations. The Ford Interceptor will come equipped with pursuit ratings, all wheel drive and more interior space than officers have ever had. These new vehicles utilize a fuel efficient V-6, rather than the old V-8 engines all in a comparable price range. With the anticipated in service date in mid March 2015, the department is excited to present this new vehicle to Council and look forward to placing the vehicle into service for the citizens of Hollidaysburg.

GET YOUR PERMITS BEFORE STARTING WORK!!

The Borough takes tremendous pride in the fact that its residents are consistently doing projects to take care of and maintain their homes. It is one of the great attributes of Hollidaysburg.

With summer on its way, many Borough residents are planning to remodel or initiate other projects regulated by Borough construction codes.

Whether you are thinking about a **new swimming pool** (in or above ground) or a **building addition**, be sure to check with the Building Code Department to determine if your project requires a permit and is

compliant with Borough construction codes.

Be mindful that Pennsylvania State Law requires that you must obtain appropriate permits to have certain types of projects done. Not obtaining the necessary permits could lead to legal action and fines. Zoning permits from the Borough may also be necessary.

Following up with a simple phone call before your project begins will ensure that your project progresses in a timely manner.

The Building Code Department is available to answer any questions you may have about construction

codes and permits Monday through Friday, 8 AM until 4 PM, in person at the Municipal Building, or by phone at 695-7543.

LOW BRANCHES ON STREET TREES

The Shade Tree Commission reminds street tree property owners that they **should remove low hanging, pedestrian unfriendly branches** from their street trees.

Unightly suckers growing out of the base of trees should be removed as well.

No permit is required for these type of street tree trimmings, however, **permits are still needed for more extensive pruning of the street trees.**

to where they can be safely disposed of by law enforcement.

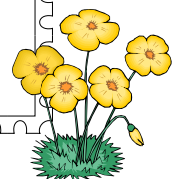
